## **1. Community Fayre**

An informal Community Fayre was held at Oaken Grove Community Centre. Several organisations came along and displayed information or provided activities to interact with. They made good use of the centres garden, playing field and building. Local councillors, Haxby and Wigginton's Street Environment officer, Neighbourhood Pride officer and Police were all there to answer any questions. The centre provided reasonably priced hotdogs, burgers and light refreshments.

### Haxby Town Junior Football Club

The football team and their coaches came along in full kit and made good use of the playing field. Several young residents from the ward watched as the team displayed their football skills.

### Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB)

A representative from CAB displayed information in the garden about the organisation including work they had been able to achieve in Haxby & Wigginton due to past funding from the Ward Committee.

### Waste Strategy

The CYC officer displayed information about recycling including home composting and kerbside collections. She also offered free plastic bottle recycling bags.

### Street Sports Bus

The Street Sports Bus team provided a sport session on the playing field. Several young people of ranging age groups practiced their football and golfing skills.

### Family Learning

A representative from Family Learning displayed information in the garden about the organisation.

### Mobile Police Unit

The Mobile Police Unit attended to answer any queries or concerns raised by residents.

## Neighbourhood Pride Unit (NPU)

A huge map of the ward was available as a reference to pin point 2007/08 local scheme suggestions. The NPU officer also made available schemes suggestion forms and grant application packs for the 2007/08 ward Committee budget.

## Haxby & Wigginton Post Natal/Breast Feeding Support Groups

A representative displayed information in the garden about the organisations including work they had been able to achieve in Haxby & Wigginton due to past funding from the Ward Committee.

## **2. Formal Section of Meeting**

There was a formal style meeting inside the centre and the following issues were discussed:

### **A. 2006/07 Schemes list**

All three Councillors agreed the list of schemes that were advertised in the July newsletter.

### **B. Have Your Say**

Residents raised the following concerns/queries:

- I. York & District Sports Federation, Haxby & Wigginton Youth and Community Association and the Group responsible for stabilising the wall at Wigginton Pond thanked the Ward committee for supporting their schemes.
- II. The issues of speeding on Mill Lane was discussed – in response it was explained that the criteria for vehicle activated signs (VAS) was due to be set at a forth coming EMAP meeting. If Mill Lane meets the set criteria then the Ward committee may support a sign.
- III. Haxby & Wigginton no longer have a snicket cleaner – The responsibility has been delegated to Street Scene. They have always been expected to provide a basic street cleansing service. However the Ward Committee in previous years has contributed to the snicket cleaner to get an enhanced service. This scheme was unfortunately not viable this year due to budget restrictions. Residents were invited to forward any areas that were particularly bad in the ward. The snicket between Oaken Grove and Little Lane was highlighted.
- IV. A resident suggested the need for a dog dirt bin on the green space near 60-62 Oaken Grove – NT to add to the 2007/08 scheme suggestion list
- V. Several residents raised the issue of wheelie bins and kerbside recycling boxes not being put back were they were found after being emptied – NT to pass concern onto the General Waste Manager of the CYC.
