Summary of LTP3 Stage 1 meetings and forums consultation December 2009 – February 2010

Purpose

Attendance by CoYC at the various meetings offered the opportunity for the attendees to discuss the high level pressures and challenges that face transport in York now and in the future and also suggest actions to tackle the transport challenges.

The aim was for the consultation to help shape and inform the options to be taken forward in LTP3.

Summary

Below is a concise summary of the most common points and themes raised at the face to face consultation exercises listed above.

Summary of discussion points:

- 1. York should not be considered in isolation and **should look outward**, particularly in terms of the quality of connections to surrounding towns and villages.
- 2. It was feit that people who are **disabled**, **aged** or otherwise **socially disadvantaged** are **not able to share in York's prosperity**, and there is a need to **avoid York becoming a twin-tracked city**.
- 3. York's population is changing with more students and people in the Black Minority Ethnic (BME) grouping .
- 4. How can York's future needs be in keeping with its unique characteristics?
- 5. Need **City leadership on the way forward** for York and **the Council needs to 'think positive'** on transport.
- 6. LTP3 to link with wider policies **as LTP3 is an enabler** to meeting the wider needs and aspirations of York.
- 7. How ambitious should we be with a reducing budget and can we deliver?
- 8. Tackling and reacting to climate change

Some important challenges for York:

- 1. **Connectivity** to global markets
- 2. The **'in / out' nature** for getting around York
- 3. Contributing to sustainable communities
- 4. Different solutions are needed for both rural and urban transport
- 5. The movement of freight conflicting with the evening economy
- 6. Contributing to a **low carbon/emission economy** and the **infrastructure to support it**
- 7. Sustainable access for visitors
- 8. Inadequate bus network and services outside 'core hours' .
- 9. Being clear of what we want to achieve and how we want to achieve it
- 10. **Deterring inappropriate cycling on footways** through better enforcement, education and training .
- 11. Congested roads are a deterrent to cycling.
- 12. Parking is expensive compared to other cities.
- 13. Winning hearts and minds for change in travel behaviour
- 14. Poor travel information

Ways forward for York:

- 1. New ways of working utilising new technologies.
- 2. **Positive campaigns** for education and promotion **avoid preaching.**
- 3. Make **better use of what we have** including the **rivers** and **voluntary sector**, but **provide new where necessary**
- 4. Better audio/visual public transport information.
- 5. Better signing for residents and visitors.
- 6. **Better integration** of public transport
- 7. Better Rail network and services
- 8. Tramway from Leeds to York
- 9. Better planning of development
- 10. Buses to towns outside York
- 11. Later running buses
- 12. Better (dualled) ring roads
- 13. Increasing active travel (cycling), particularly children
- 14. **Demand management** practices (e.g. remove commercial traffic in city centre and Road User Charging (RUC)) **were supported** but need to be mindful that RUC disadvantages the less well-off.
- 15. **Circular** (free if possible) **bus route** linking outer areas, but should be more than just hub and wheel
- 16. Good promotion and monitoring of **travel plans** and **rewards** in their use.
- 17. Reward the use of low carbon/low emission vehicles
- 18. More cycle tracks
- 19. More pedestrian rights of way
- 20. More safety education for all modes
