Background

- Enhanced Partnership Forum meetings –
 enquiries often made about improving disabled
 people's bus access. But there was no simple
 way for the partnership to provide updates.
- Task & Finish Group set up to resolve this
- The group set up a tracker, listing issues and progress

Bus Accessibility Tracker

- A document to show progress made on issues relating to access to bus services for disabled people
- Lists the issues
- Lists the workstreams to resolve those issues
- Shows progress of those workstreams
- Updated monthly

Bus Accessibility Tracker

- Mainly for updating the public not a programme management tool
- Doesn't guarantee that every issue on the list will be resolved
- But the tracker should enable efficient and informed discussions

Headlines

- The first e-ink display has been installed in Elvington. 6 more planned (so far)
- Mobility Scooter permit system now explained on an iTravel webpage
- Council talking to bus operators to understand their driver training and opportunities for enhancements
- Investigating free taxi rides for access refusals

Park & Ride

- 'Changing places toilets' to be introduced at Rawcliffe and Grimston Bar
- Will improve parking spaces for disabled people
- A report will go to Transport Exec 7th October to get some funding. Then design work take place, which YAF can be consulted on


