Introduction

- 2011 Census data is currently in the 1st phase of release
- Overall York Data was released in October 2012
- Lower Level Data was released on the 23rd of November 2012
- This presentation includes the key highlights of this data with further data stored in the BI Hub and via ONS

Overall

- York's population has risen from 181,103 in 2001 to 198,051 in 2011
- In 2011 York has 16,948 (9.4%) more people than in 2001 when our last census took place which showed the population as 181,103.
- It is also 2.2% lower than previous predictions (mid year 2010).
- There are several key variances across wards, lower geography levels and age ranges

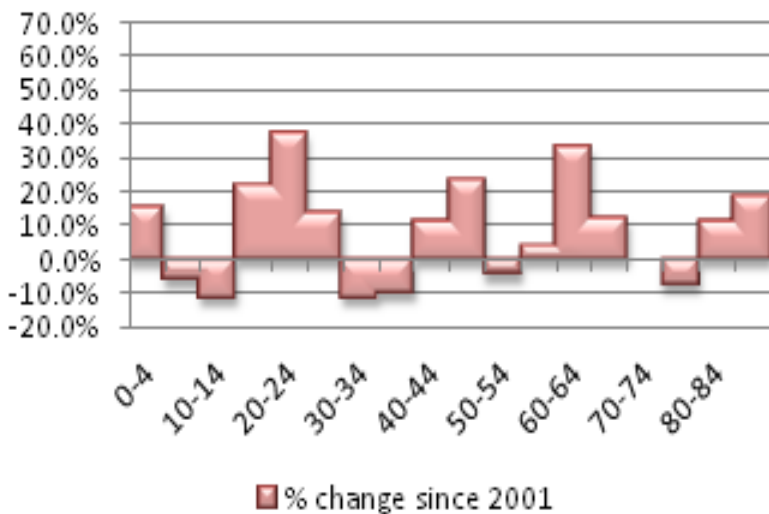


Regional and National Comparisons

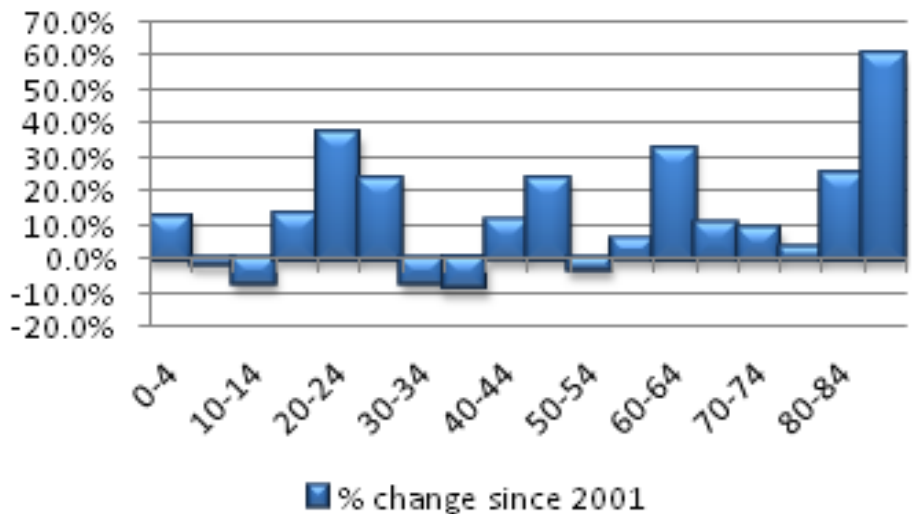
- York's population grew more than the Yorkshire and Humber and England. (9.4% compared to 6.2% and 7.2%)
- York's 20-24 year olds vary significantly from both the regional and national proportions at 10% compared to 7.2% and 6.8% respectively. It has also grown by 38% compared to 25% and 20%.
- Decrease in York's 5-14 age range is similar to the regional and national drop.
- The 85 and over age range has grown more than regionally and nationally at 38% compared to 20% and 23%.

Gender by Age Change

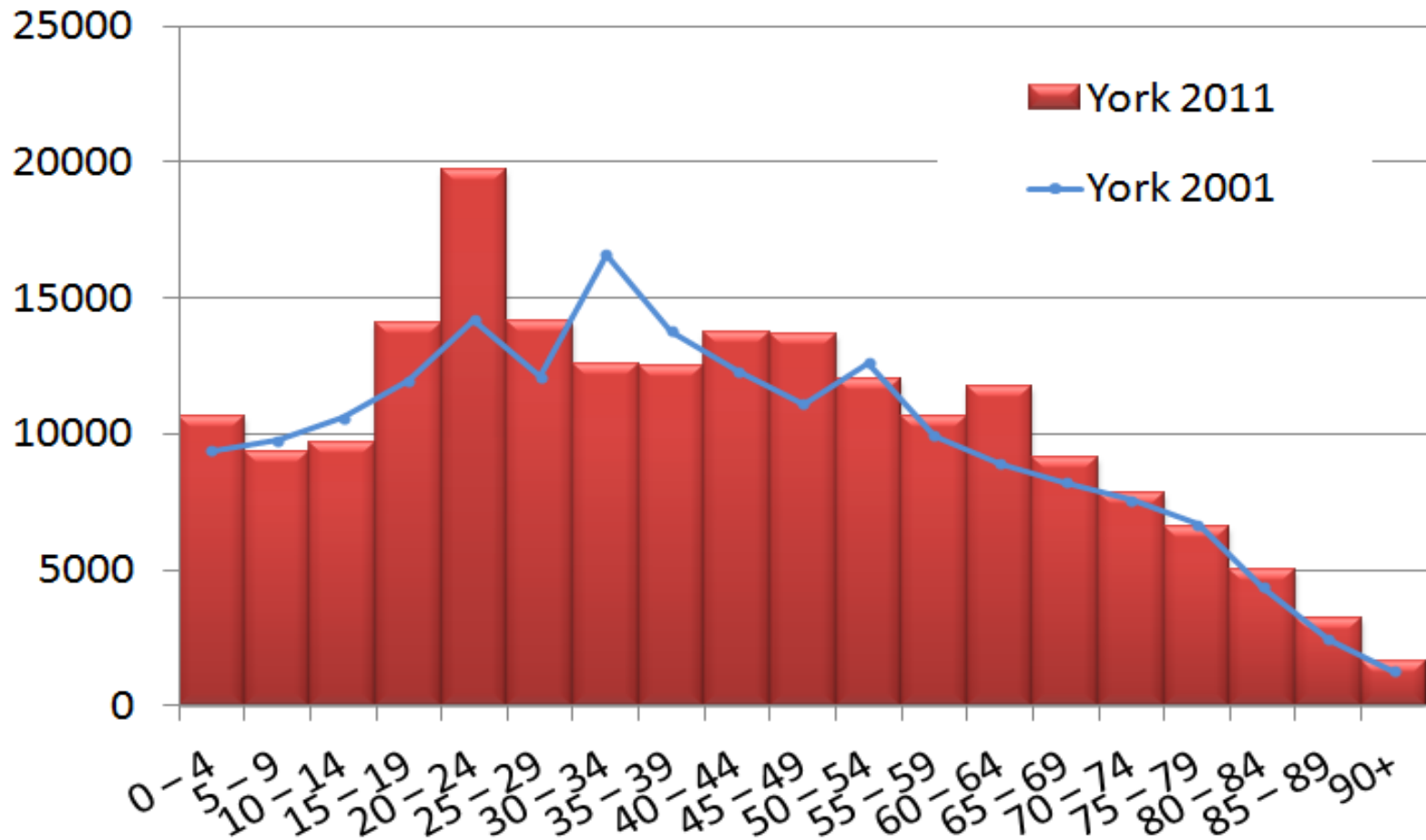
Census 2011 - Female % Change

2011 Compared to 2001 by 5 Year Age Bands

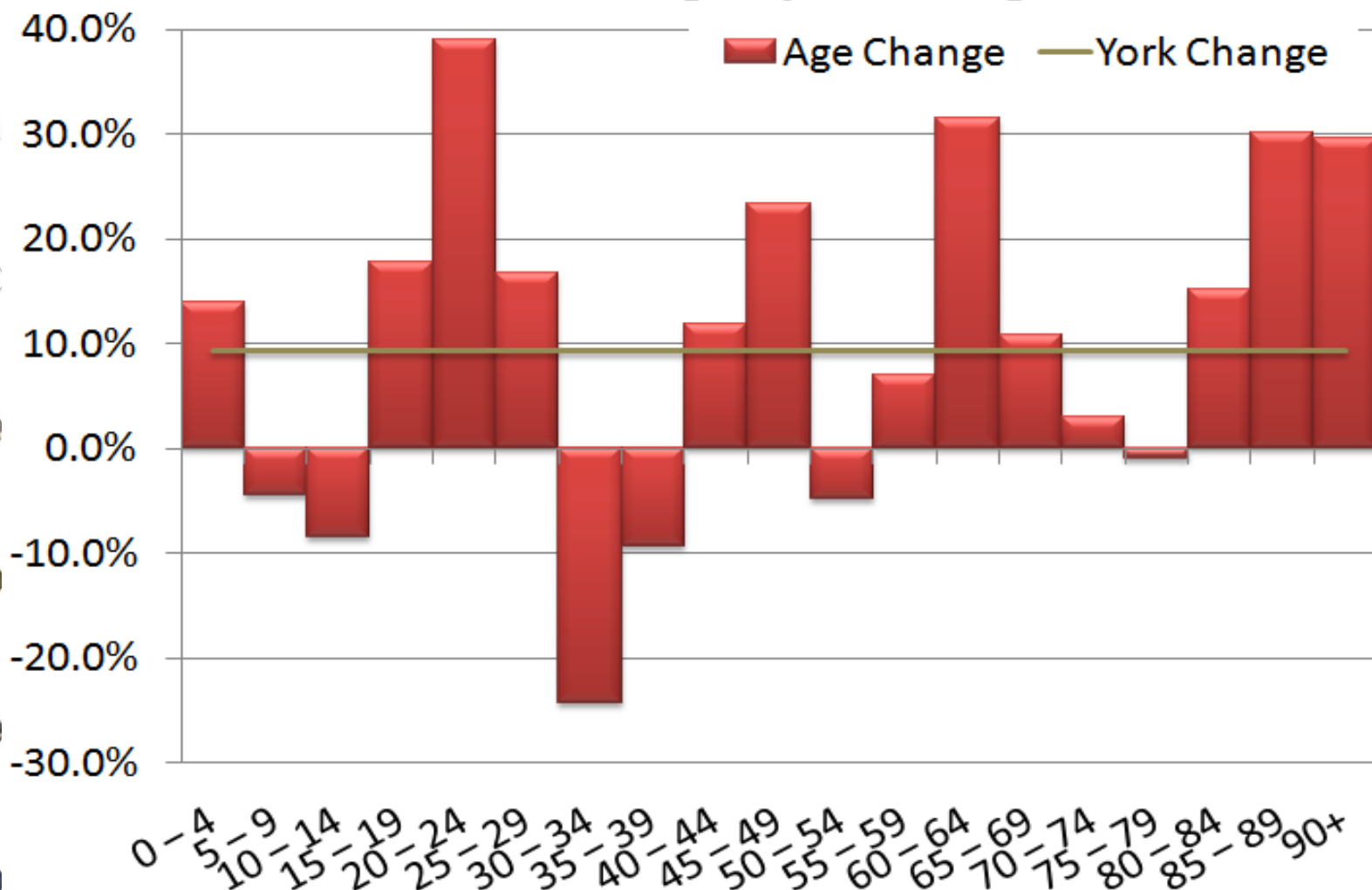


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2011 to 2001 % Change by 5 Year Age Bands



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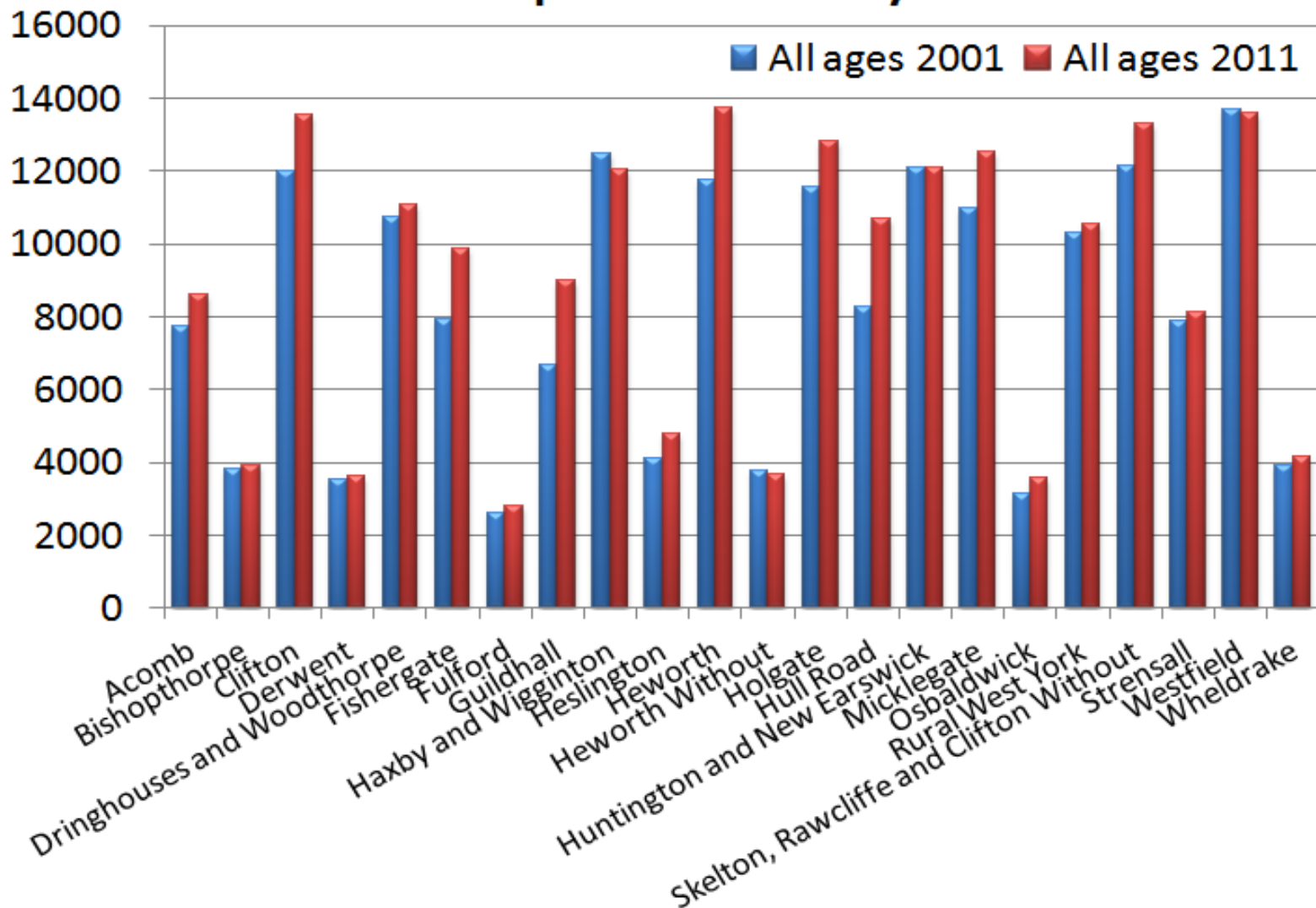


At a Ward level

2011 Compared to 2001 by Ward

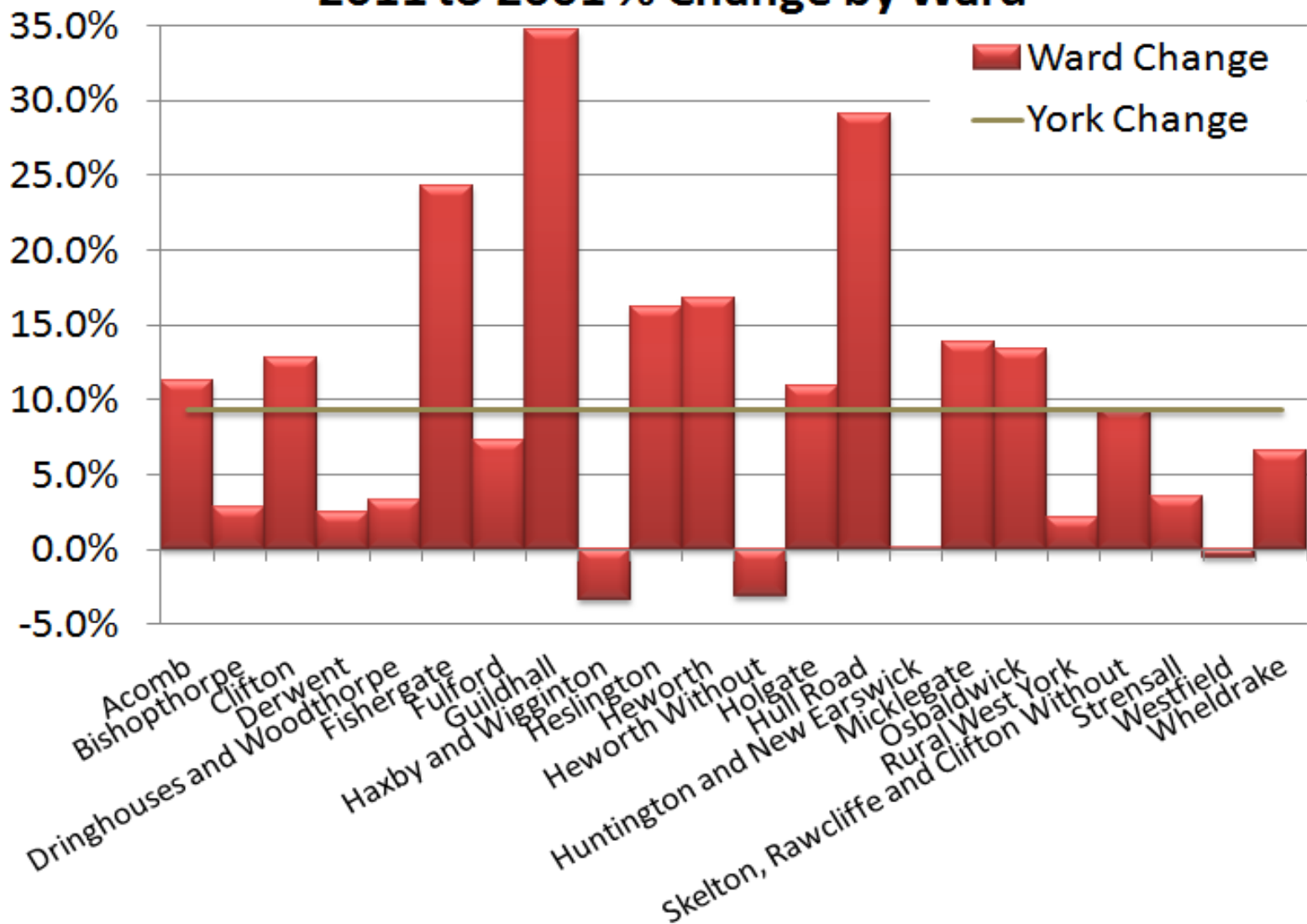


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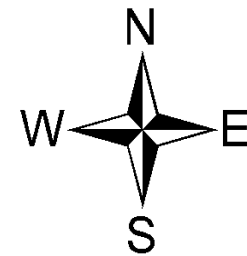
2011 to 2001 % Change by Ward



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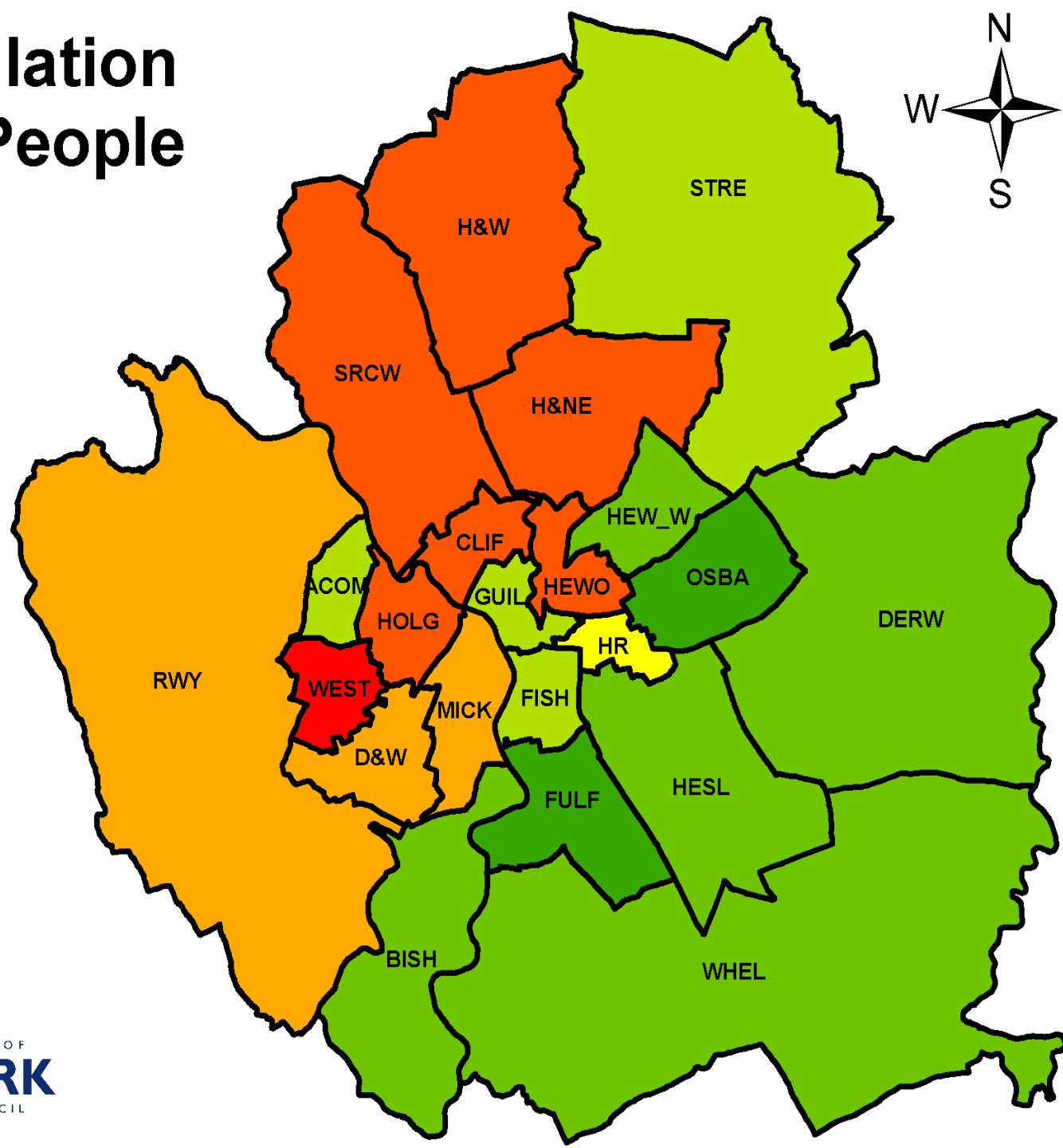
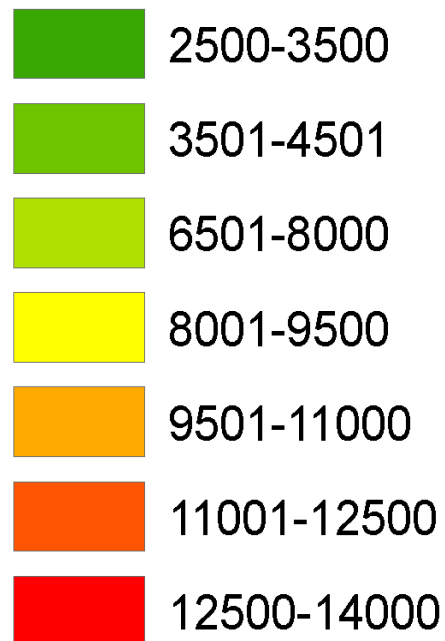


Census Population - Number of People by Ward

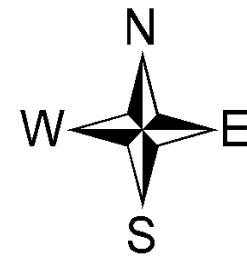

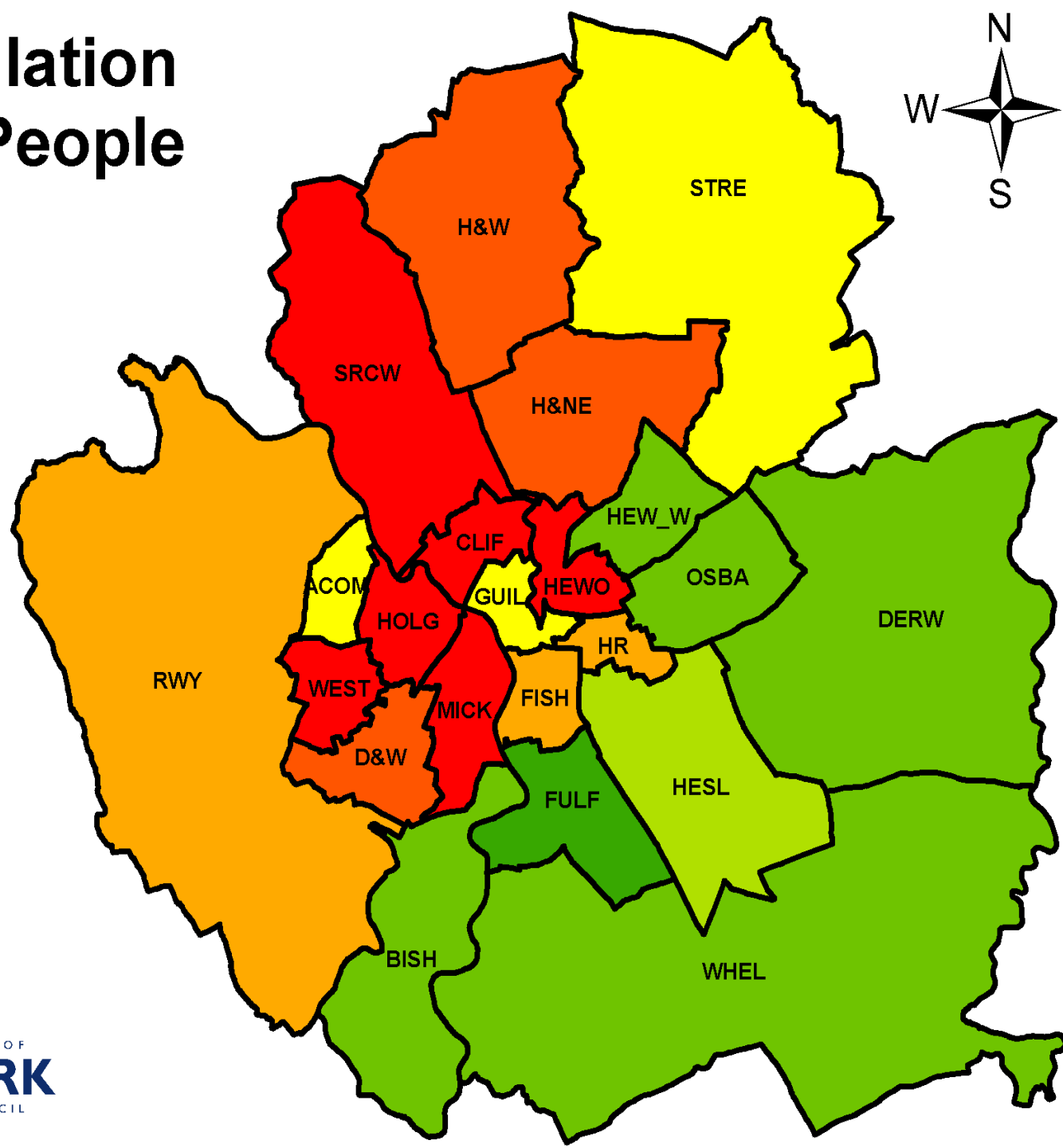
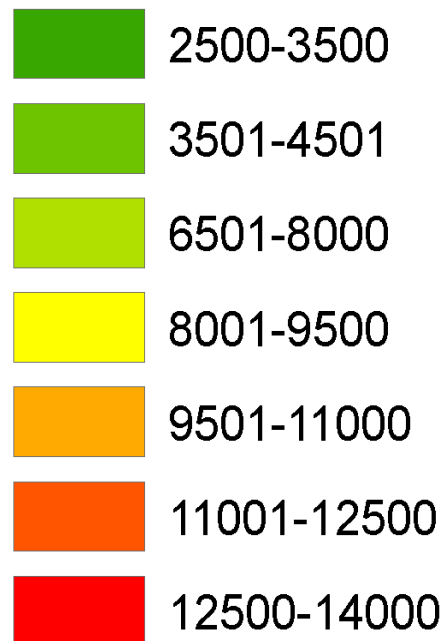


Census Population - Number of People by Ward

All Ages - 2011

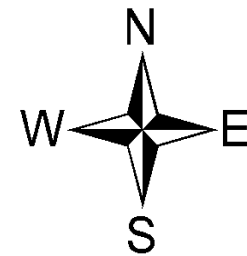




By LSOA

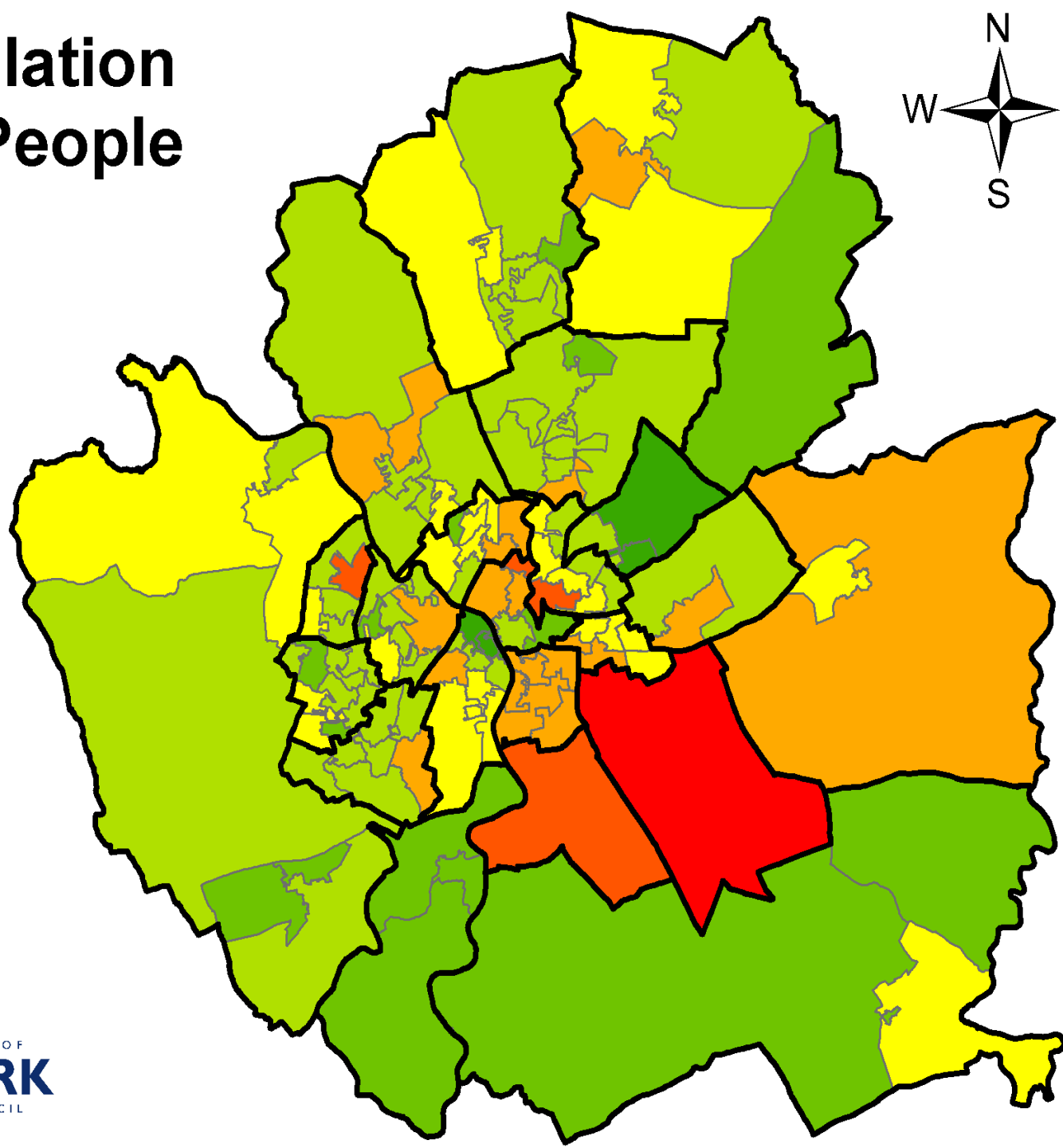
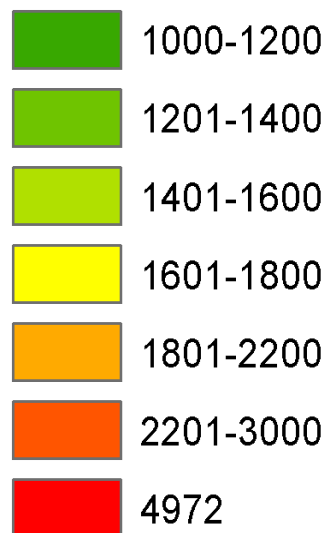
- The following map shows the 2011 by Lower Super Output Area (LSOA)
- These are similar sized areas enabling benchmark comparisons with other areas in the UK.
- These are between 100 and 3000 households
- The exception being Heslington due to the university campus.
- 2 LSOAs around the city centre have been split into 2 due to an increased population.
- Therefore we now have 120 LSOAs instead of 118

All Ages - 2011 LSOA





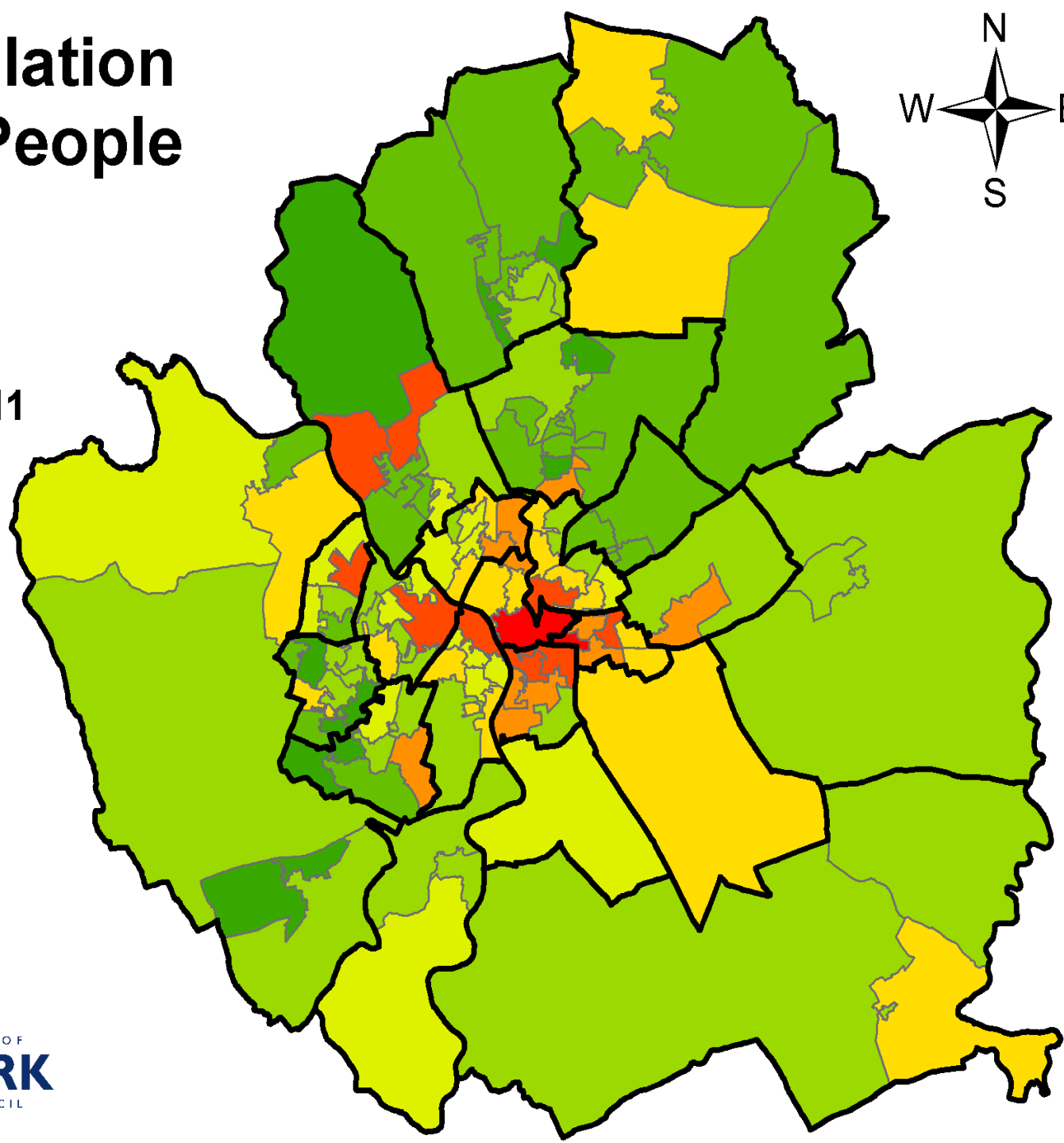
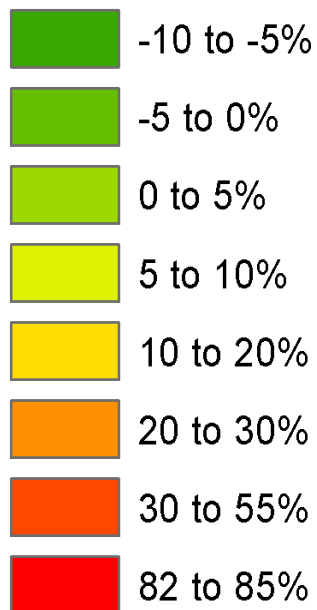
LSOA Change
