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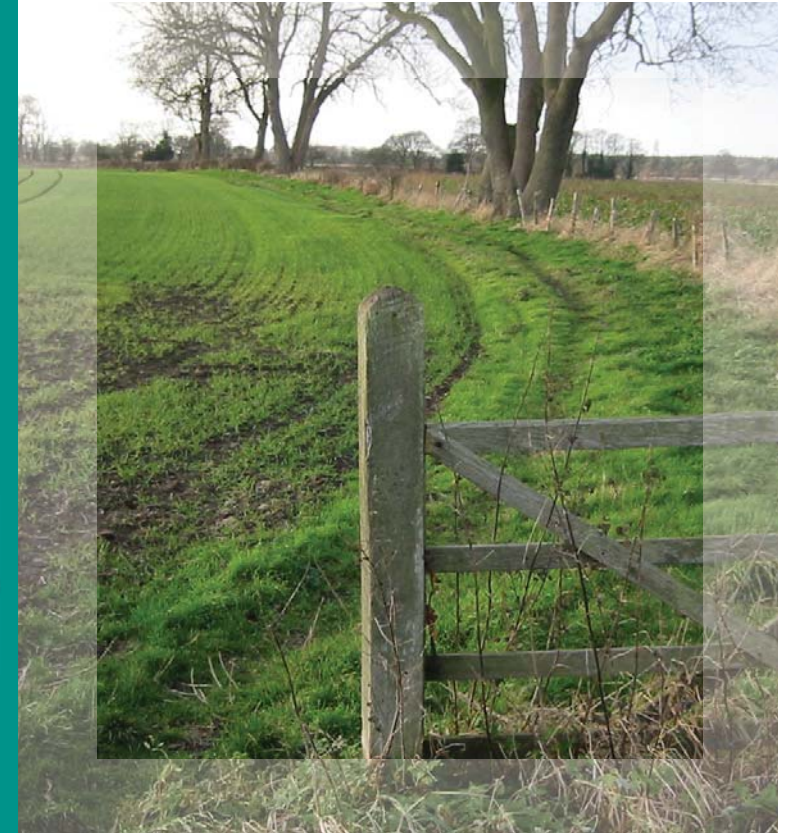

The walk starts from Main Street in Deighton village. Look for a gap in the hedge by a concealed signpost opposite Rudstone House and near the entrance to Pasture Farm. Follow the path along the edge of Pasture Farm. Cross a stile into a small paddock, leaving the paddock by another stile, turn right and walk around a small pond. Dragonflies can often be seen in the summer months. Continue along the path, following the field edge, the path doglegs right and then left before running parallel with a quiet lane for a short stretch. Turn right, continuing along the field edge before turning sharp left by a waymark post. Continue between fields following an old field boundary where a hedgerow has been removed, large trees dotted along this section show the historical line of this boundary. At the end of the field you will reach a small copse. Follow the path along the edge of the trees, turn left at a farm track and enter the yard of a large farm called Gillrudding Grange.

Follow this track keeping the farm buildings on your left. About 200m further along with the farm behind you, the path turns left. Continue along this track passing another farm on your right, the track remains good walking all the way until it meets a junction with an old railway line. This is the former York – Selby line that is now carries the cycle route No.65 and the Trans-Pennine Trail. (To visit the riverside village of Naburn cross straight over this old railway line and continue along the track which eventually becomes a road leading into the village.)

Turn left down the good path along the old railway line

(Short cut; Distance: 4.5 miles Time: 2 hours). After $\frac{3}{4}$ mile you will come to a bridge carrying a lane over the path. This is Moor Lane Bridge, at this point should be feeling weary, you can climb up onto Moor Lane from the cycle track and walk, left, back along the Lane to Deighton village (about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles).

(Cont. Circular walk) For the longer route, carry on along the track under the bridge. After a further mile you will reach a second bridge. Turn right off the path up the bank and onto the lane over the bridge. At the top of the bank turn left back towards Deighton. Follow the bridge over the cycle track leading you down to where it gradually becomes a more well established farm track. When you reach a small narrow wooded strip turn right and follow the path that winds through and follows the line of trees. At the far end, where a waymarking post is sited, turn left along the field edge which will bring you out at a farm. This is Crabtree Farm. At the farm turn left down a wide track and follow the track back towards Deighton. This track brings you out onto a road opposite a large house. This is Deighton Hall. Turn right following the road to the main York Selby Road. Turn left and follow the footway for about 400m and turn left returning you to Deighton Village and the start of the walk
