Guidelines to help cyclists and pedestrians on the streets of York

Cyclists: make sure the driver has seen you







The Problem:

The cyclist is not seen by the driver as the car exits the junction.

What you should do:

- Check behind you, think about your position
- If able, move away from the kerb
- Look for eye contact. Stop if you are in danger.

Pedestrians: check for traffic, don't rely on the green man




The Problem:

Crossing when the green man shows without looking.



What you should do:

- **1.** Check the green man
- **2.** Look to the right. Is traffic stopping?



3. Look to the left. Is traffic stopping?

Keep checking in all directions whilst crossing

Cyclists: look out for long vehicles turning left.



The Problem:

The long vehicle is turning left, trapping the cyclist.



What should I do if the long vehicle arrives first at the stop line?

Wait behind the long vehicle.



What should I do if I arrive first?

Move over to block the long vehicle.
