# **FIVE POINT PLAN**

## 1 - MAKE SURE YOU KNOW THE LAW

As an employer you have a legal responsibility to ensure that any staff who drive at work are safe. (See the legislation worksheet.)



#### **2 - CONSIDER THE RISKS**

A risk assessment is nothing more than a careful examination of activities at work that could cause harm to people. (See the worksheet on assessing the risks.)

## ᄊ 3 - DEVELOP A POLICY

A work-related driving policy is simply a document that identifies the risks and sets out how you are going to manage them.

### **4 - RAISE AWARENESS AMONG YOUR EMPLOYEES**
