- Protect the environment.


To achieve these goals, we all need to examine how we can unleash our potential.

Get York moving

An effective transport system that lets people and vehicles move efficiently around the city is vital to its success.

Cutting congestion on the roads by making people less reliant on the car will support economic growth and improve air quality for all.

- Expanding Park & Ride services
- Improving local bus services
- Developing York's cycling and pedestrian network
- Improving city centre circulation
- Establishing 20mph speed limits in York's residential areas
- Campaigning to encourage less reliance on the car.



Build strong communities

Strong communities are the foundation of a thriving city.

We want York to be a place where active and self-reliant communities really have a say in local issues and where everyone feels they belong.

- Talking with and listening to people – including the city's younger residents
- Encouraging and supporting more volunteers
- Making everyone feel and be safer
- Providing more and better opportunities for leisure and culture
- Allowing the right mix of homes, schools, GPs, shops and community facilities to support and sustain local communities.





Protect vulnerable people

We would like to help and support our growing older population to live more independently and give them more choice and control over their daily lives.

We also want to ensure that York's children grow up happy and settled in families wherever possible.

- Providing great care facilities
- Investing in services to support people to live in their own homes
- Ensuring vulnerable adults are safe while promoting their independence
- Setting up a Health and Wellbeing Board
- Supporting families who may be struggling
- Running the Fairness Commission.





Protect the environment

York has an outstanding built and natural environment and world class heritage.

These star qualities need to be used to attract further investment and lasting growth, without compromising what makes the city such a beautiful place.

- Cutting our carbon emissions and improving air quality
- Managing our green space
- Improving how we look after the city's heritage and old buildings
