Local Action Group Meeting Actions

Calendar of Engagement

The LAG wants to ensure that the views of local residents, businesses, community groups and organisations are reflected in the Local Development Strategy. We are building a calendar of activity and would like the opportunity to join in with events and activities in the project area. If you are running an community event and it would be appropriate for us to come along please let us know.

Communications Working Group

The LAG agreed to set up a set up a working group to ensure that information about the project is clear and accessible.

Community Engagement Strategy

The group want to ensure that our consultations with the community are based upon on the strengths and opportunities available to the community and will be using an asset-based community development (ABCD) approach.

Review of existing engagement resources

We are collecting and reviewing the results of recent consultations in order to make the most of existing information and to prevent duplication.

It was suggested that we use Tang Hall Big Local research as a starting point to develop our own engagement strategy. We will also evaluate recent consultations to inform future consultations.

Frequently asked questions

Q What is the purpose of a Local Action Group (LAG)?

A The local Action Group will be made up of a majority of community and business representatives as well as public sector. This group will be responsible for overseeing the creation of the Local Development Strategy and is the decision making body for the project.

Q What does the LAG do?

A The LAG will meet regularly to bring together the Local Development Strategy. This will involve analysing the project area to identify the area's potential and its developmental needs. The LAG will then be tasked with creating a set of objectives and ranking these based on the views of the community.

Q What will I have to do as a LAG member?

A As a LAG member, you will help to represent the views of the community when deciding upon the objectives of the Local Development Strategy. You will also need to be pro-active in helping to engage the community and get people on board with the project. Being a LAG member does have a certain level of commitment, however there are lots of ways of getting involved so please get in contact with us.


