## **APPENDIX K**

## Air Quality Management Area – City Centre [No.1] Description and Map

The boundary of the City Centre Air Quality Management Area (AQMA) was approved on the 8<sup>th</sup> January 2002. The largest area available was chosen following consultation with residents and businesses, which supported this option. On the 21<sup>st</sup> January 2002 the Order declaring the AQMA came into force.

The AQMA has been established due to the prediction that levels of nitrogen dioxide (NO<sub>2</sub>), in certain areas of the city, may breach the annual objective in 2005 of 21ppb ( $40\mu g/m^3$ ) (based on a 95% confidence limit). The source of NO<sub>2</sub> is from combustion technologies. In York this is predominantly generated from traffic.

Following the declaration the council is now legally obliged to produce a 4<sup>th</sup> Stage Review and Assessment and an Air Quality Action Plan (AQAP). The 4<sup>th</sup> Stage Review and Assessment will form the technical justification for the solutions contained within the AQAP. An important element of this work will be calculating how much of a reduction in this pollutant is needed to deliver the air quality objectives by 2005 and to apportion the sources of the pollutant more accurately.
