
Further to my 21st February – 4th April Consultation response, I commented on how the Key Diagram was misleading in representing just the General Extent of the Green Belt as sites allocations had been added to the diagram on areas already designated as Green Belt.

I believe this is actually the Key Diagram that should have been used, as it not only shows the General Extent of the Green Belt, but also the differences between the size and sustainability of the existing villages and the role they play in York and its surrounding settlements character which the plan is supposed to be protecting:-



However if it's felt a more detailed one is required, then the following should be used as it shows the current development limits of the existing villages, in particular with regard to Wheldrake, that land previously excluded from the Green Belt by the Planning Inspector as per the 2005 Draft Local Plan that utilises the Planning Inspectors report from the York Green Belt Public Inquiry shows a linear boundary along the northern side of the village therefore encompassing an area of white space with the intention of permitting development to take place on it which I suspect is equally applicable to the other smaller villages that can't sustain additional development:-
