Transport delivery

Delivered

- The new Scarborough Bridge over the River Ouse for pedestrians/cyclists was successfully delivered in 2019
- £72m has been secured to fund phase 1 of dualling/junction improvements on the A1237 northern ring road (section from A19 Shipton Road to Little Hopgrove)
- £26m has been secured for the project to rebuild the area around York Station and provide better bus interchange facilities
- £12m has been secured to deliver the Castle Gateway project in the city centre
- £155m has been secured to develop the York Central site, including transport expenditure on the access road, western side of York Station and infrastructure for active modes and buses
- £5m has been secured/ committed for range of active mode schemes across the city.

Business cases being formulated at the time of Examination (March 2022):

- Dualling scheme for A1237 between A59 and A19 Shipton Road junctions: preliminary cost estimate of £86m
- Development of a railway station at Haxby currently being developed through a New Stations grant – estimated cost of £17m
- A project to replace 44 diesel buses with electric equivalents - application made to DfT's ZEBRA bid of £9m, supported by **FirstGroup**
- A Bus Service Improvement Plan comprising £40m measures to develop bus services in York has been submitted to the Department for Transport
- A programme of improvements to streets and the public realm in York city centre being developed as part of the York and North Yorkshire devolution request, with an anticipated cost of £20m
