In respect of this matter I should state that I am no longer ward councillor for Fishergate ward which includes this area. However as a local resident and Green Party representative I would object to the area identified EX/CYC/124 as excluded in total since this would not be complying with the principle of following the boundary wall. On the west side of the Stray, the Green Belt should extend up to and including the 'Herdsman's Cottage' on Heslington Rd - as will be obvious from the title, this is an integral feature of the historic stray open common, and is also the location of remains of earth works associated with first and second world war practice ranges which link across the proposed boundary. Similarly, on the east side the field running up to the old Heslington Rd provides a natural separation between the boundary wall of the Retreat and the perimeter of the University. This is open grazing land which has cattle on it roaming freely from the rest of the stray.

Please can these points be taken into consideration when determining the proposed modificatio	n.
